Workshop Summary

This workshop will focus on APA Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct, as well as specific issues of ethical concern to professionals practicing in Alaska. Dr. Bradbury will speak on the most common ethical complaints against psychologists and psychological associates in Alaska and nationally. The distinction (and sometimes fuzziness) between clinical and forensic practice will be addressed. Issues of supervision will be addressed, such as supervision of psychologists and psychological associates in training, supervision of psychologists and psychological associates as a disciplinary action, and the distinction between the role of therapist and supervisor of a psychologist or psychological associate during a disciplinary action. In addition to these practice issues, Dr. Bradbury will discuss what to do if one sees fellow professionals involved in ethical violation and how to manage ethical dilemmas.

The goal of the workshop is to review and renew knowledge of ethical standards and guidelines for the practice of psychology. A portion of the workshop will be spent addressing specific concerns raised by attendees in pre-workshop communications with the presenter (see below). This workshop is primarily directed toward behavioral health practitioners who are professionally bound by the APA code of ethics or who have ethical concerns and questions.

Workshop Objectives

- Learn/review basic principles and ethical standards of the APA ethical guidelines and of the ethical standards for the state of Alaska.
- Learn the difference between clinical and forensic practice. Learn to identify a forensic referral in a clinical practice.
- Learn practice guidelines for managing ethical dilemmas with clients and/or peers
- Address specific ethical questions of participants
- Learn how the state Division of Occupational Licensing manages ethical complaints

About the Speaker - Dr. Lorin L. Bradbury

Dr. Bradbury earned a Bachelor of Liberal Arts Degree (1988) from the University of Alaska Southeast, a Masters of Science degree in Counselor Education (1990) from the University of Wisconsin – Madison, and a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology (1992) from the University of Mississippi. After earning his Ph.D., he completed a one-year Residency in Clinical and Counseling Psychology at Region III Mental Health Center in Tupelo, Mississippi.

Returning to Alaska in 1993, Dr. Bradbury accepted a position as Psychologist for the Yukon-Kuskokwim Health Corporation in Bethel, and remained in that position for eleven years. In 2004, he ventured into private practice. Finding the majority of the referrals in his private practice were forensic in nature, he made a decision to work toward a specialty in Forensic Psychology. In October 2005, he was admitted to Candidacy Status, and in November 2006, he passed the knowledge exam to become Board Certified in Forensic Psychology by the American Board of Professional Psychology (ABPP)/American Board of Forensic Psychology (ABFP). The next step is to produce and defend work samples before an oral board.

Dr. Bradbury was appointed to the Board of Psychologists and Psychological Associate Examiners in 2003 by Governor Murkowski. He was reappointed to the same Board in 2006 for a four-year term.

In addition to the practice of psychology, Dr. Bradbury is an ordained minister with the United Pentecostal Church. He served as pastor in Hoonah and Juneau for six years each, and has served a growing congregation in Bethel for the past thirteen years.
